



However, because Rev Elizabeth is much loved and appreciated, we wish for her a welldeserved, happy, and fulfilling retirement. Thankfully, we have several months yet in which to share in her company and our ministry. Do make your personal best wishes and

UCM Council is underway with process & procedure for a Clergy Search by preparing a UCM Profile & Clergy Position Description that must be submitted and approved by ECORC before we can post the position 'live' on the Church Hub. #### Updates from UCM Council - from meeting Jan 30

1) Thank you to Don Woodrow for his many years of service on the UCM M&P Team. He retired from the position as of Dec 15, 2024. There is a vacancy on this team - if anyone should be interested please contact Kerri Jebson. Other M&P members are Kathy Davidson, Betty Guthrie, and Sandra Maye.

2) The Proposed 2025 UCM Budget will be used provisionally until approval at our UCM Annual Meeting on June 8 at Woodville UC. We are using \$40,000 from our UCM reserves (i.e. St Andrew's legacy donation) for this year's budget to help alleviate partners' assessment contributions 3) Our Team Administrator Ruth Fallding has had her yearly contract renewed - with many thanks to her for her continued good work. She has given notice, however, that she would like to retire from the position Jan 31, 2026.

4) On Sun March 2 UCM Worship Leaders will be using the Order of Service/materials from the prepared UCW Centennial Worship Service

5) On Sun June 8 we will be incorporating UCC 100th Anniversary themed materials into our joint service at Woodville, as well as special music, and a pot-luck lunch

6) We will be removing our Student Intern (SME) position from our Church Hub as there have been no applications, and there is only one month left for the UCC funding to be used

7) UCM Community Gardeners are getting underway shortly with a planning meeting scheduled

8) We have updated our UCM Policy & Procedure Manual with: Communion Preparation Procedure for consistency; and Pulpit Supply provision for Clergy Illness under 2 weeks duration (over 2 weeks comes under The UCC Restorative Care Plan)

9) Congregations are reminded of several items to undertake annually:

- update your Congregation's Profile on your Church Hub account -ECORC advises that a MOTION at your annual meeting is necessary to approve this to take place - submit your annual UCC Statistics to your Church Hub account by March 3

- submit to ECORC annually your Congregational Self Assessment Survey



#### The Witness Blanket is NOT a blanket!

However, much like a family quilt, it is made of various panels, each telling its own story. The many panels bear Witness to the Residential School Survivors. Each of the 889 pieces of history, which make up the panels, was salvaged from Residential Schools all across Canada. A shoe, a bell, a door knob, a braid of hair and more all tell a story. The yellow plastic mush-bowl, from the Mohawk Institute in Brantford, was used as a reminder of food, whether there was ever enough and the quality of the mush/porridge. Maggots and sour milk were often served.

The Witness Blanket is almost 40 feet long (12 meters) and 10.5 feet high (3 meters) made of Red Wood Cedar from British Columbia. Some of the panels weigh over 300 lbs. When assembled, the 13 panels weigh more than 2 tons (1.8 metric tons). Artist, Carey Newman, lives on northern Vancouver Island and made this display as a tribute to his father, a survivor, and as a reminder to all in Truth and Reconciliation.

As we often wrap ourselves in a blanket for comfort, the Witness Blanket is meant to be a reminder that Residential Schools will never happen again and our Indigenous Brothers and Sisters can take comfort in that fact.
