Easter Message – Rev. Elizabeth

From the Miriam Webster Dictionary, the meaning of resurgence: a rising again into life, activity, or prominence. A rising again into life - easily seen in the natural world around us, as nature emerges from the frozen ground with crocus blooms, and from the bare tree branches, budding leaves.

Resurgence in Spring is filled with these beautiful moments. But resurgence also involves the not so picturesque bits – mud and puddles, rain and wind. Because resurgence signals change in the world about you. Resurgence is a pouring forth, a bubbling up, a whisking away, revealing in its wake, signs of new life.

Easter is about new life in Christ. The stone that sealed the tomb will be discovered rolled away. The grave clothes will be placed to one side. An angel will offer words of guidance to the disciples who, in the darkness of the early morning, are confused and afraid by what they are seeing. It doesn't make any sense. Until it does. Jesus Christ is risen from the dead.

There is a resurgence of faith, of hope, of joy. A story that is this old has this remarkable ability to continue to rise to new life, each year that Easter is celebrated around the world. In the words we sing, in the joy of the music, in the change of liturgical colours to white and gold, from the purple of Lent.

There is something quite remarkable too when we have the chance to attend a sunrise service – there is something of the 'original' walk to the tomb that we trace in our footsteps, as we gather by water, or a field, or in some places a cemetery. And we see the mist over the waters, feel the cold of the early morning air, smell the crispness in that air, hear the birds singing from the trees. And as we gather and watch the sun break over the horizon, we sing. We sing of a rising again into new life.

This is a story that will never ever die. Jesus Christ is risen today! Alleluia!

- 4 of our Communities of Faith are served by student ministers.



The Witness Blanket is NOT a blanket!

However, much like a family quilt, it is made of various panels, each telling its own story. The many panels bear Witness to the Residential School Survivors. Each of the 889 pieces of history, which make up the panels, was salvaged from Residential Schools all across Canada. A shoe, a bell, a door knob, a braid of hair and more all tell a story. The yellow plastic mush-bowl, from the Mohawk Institute in Brantford, was used as a reminder of food, whether there was ever enough and the quality of the mush/porridge. Maggots and sour milk were often served.

The Witness Blanket is almost 40 feet long (12 meters) and 10.5 feet high (3 meters) made of Red Wood Cedar from British Columbia. Some of the panels weigh over 300 lbs. When assembled, the 13 panels weigh more than 2 tons (1.8 metric tons). Artist, Carey Newman, lives on northern Vancouver Island and made this display as a tribute to his father, a survivor, and as a reminder to all in Truth and Reconciliation.

As we often wrap ourselves in a blanket for comfort, the Witness Blanket is meant to be a reminder that Residential Schools will never happen again and our Indigenous Brothers and Sisters can take comfort in that fact.



Trinity UC Cannington has been approved as a host community venue for the public display of the Witness Blanket (Sept 8 to Oct 15, 2025) that is touring Canada.
